## **COIN CORNER**

One of the most scarce coins, the Confederate half dollar was produced at the New Orleans Mint when taken over by the Confederacy. There are only four originals and none have changed hands in many years. Confederate Secretary of the Treasury Christopher G. Memminger ordered the Mint to prepare a new design for a half dollar in April 1861. The engraver, August Pattterson, retained the obverse US 1861 die captured with the mint but created new reverse which featured the Confederate shield, an Liberty cap, and Wreaths of sugan canes and cotton encircled by 'CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA' and 'HALF DOL'.

In Mid-April, four proofs were struck by screw press. One of the coins went to Memminger, one to a mint melter and refiner, one to a local doctor, and the fourth went to Jeff Davis. Amazingly, all four coins can be accounted for today, with three being in private hands. Jeff Davis' coin did not turn up until 1930 coming from a man whose father purchased it from a Union soldier (possible one who guarded Davis). One coin is in the American Numismatic Society.

What would one be worth today? One can only wonder, but it would most likely be an enormous amount.
